### An interview with Anita Fletcher

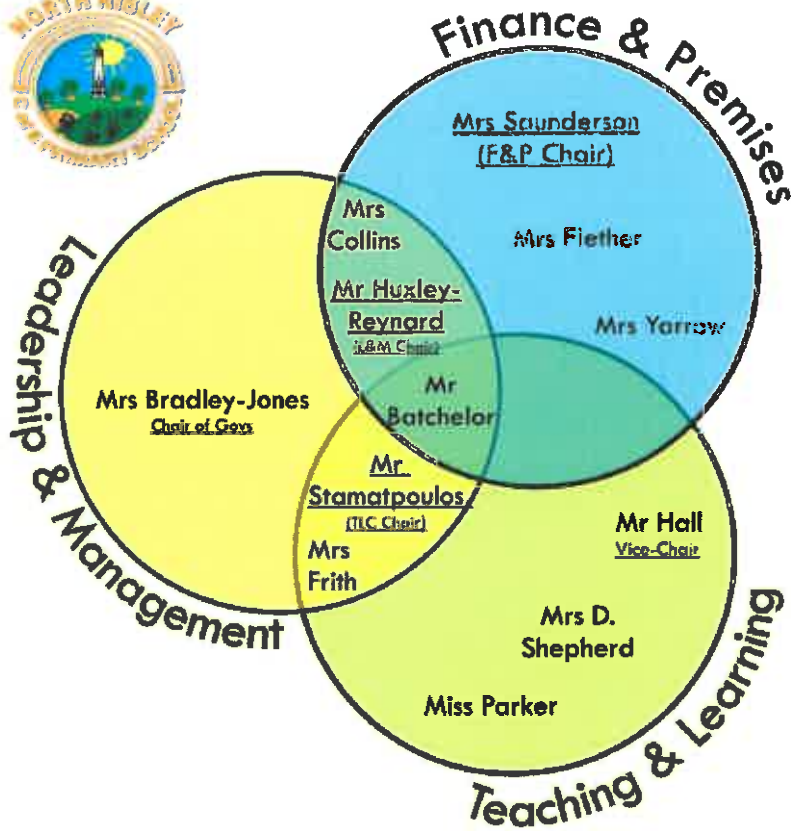
Aside from being a Governor, what do you do? **I work as a school Business Manager at a junior school in Gloucester and, prior to its closure, I was the Business Manager at Vale of Berkeley College.**

With your own particular area of expertise in mind, how do you hope to contribute to the governance of the school? **I have a very strong interest in Finance having worked in school finance for the past 16 years, so I hope this experience will be of benefit, as I know this not the easiest area to understand. I also have had a lot of experience with refurbishments and builds within a school environment so hopefully will have something to contribute to the management of the Premises. Both of which are very fortunate as I am a member of the Finance and Premises Committee.**

What outside interests do you have? **I am on the Recreation Committee, which manages the playing field for the North Nibley Parish Council, and am on the Youth Club rota. But my pleasure is walking, gardening and socialising with good friends, some of whom I became friendly with when my children went to North Nibley School in the early 1980's.**

What's your initial impression of the school, having been removed from it for a number of years? **It's grown! A lot of work has been done both inside and out, but it's still the lovely school that my family has attended for many generations.**

## What does being a Governor involve?



The Governors meet as a whole three times a year as a whole governing board at Full Governor Body meetings. The first one of the year decides who will be Chair and Vice-Chair, and discusses and approves the school's 'School Improvement Plan', a document that guides the visions for the academic year as proposed by the Head, with input from the staff as a reflection of the previous year's successes and less-than-successes. In every other half term, each of the committees meets to discuss their particular speciality and review the aspect of the school most suited to their members. As each committee's name suggests, they have a focus and a priority that ensures that the school in all its activities, visible or 'behind the scenes', is as excellent as it can be. For example, the Finance committee agrees a budget for the school for the year and ensures that it does not exceed the expenditure - a difficult task indeed!

In addition, we meet periodically on a more informal level at 'strategy meetings', so that we can ensure that our governance is being critically evaluated and ideas for improvement can be explored. One of the successes of these meetings was finding our new governors.

Aside from meetings and discussions, the Governors come into school formally at least once a month to observe lessons, do a premise inspection, speak to children and staff about the learning taking place or take part in some other aspect of the school. These visits result in a fairly detailed report which is shared with the relevant committee and serves as evidence of good governance. From time to time, a governor might see fit to visit the school informally to attend Friday assembly, see a club in action or speak to Mr Batchelor. These visits are noted in a diary which is kept in the reception area at school.

## From an idea to reality

In the parent survey in Summer 2016, there was a question about the provision of wrap-around care at the school. When parents suggest the need for this, it is a legal requirement for the Governors to endeavour to meet this need at school. It was seen as a weakness in the subsequent SWOT analysis and therefore became one of the strategic long-term goals of the Governing Board to try to provide this service. Chris Huxley-Reynard, the then Chair of Finance and Premises, championed the whole process. Various nearby schools were visited to see how it might work in a similar setting to the one we have at North Nibley, a number of local providers were interviewed to assess their suitability and eventually our Chair and Head ventured north to meet with Superstars, a company based in Leicestershire, who seemed both keen and capable of providing this facility at North Nibley School. After a few logistical hiccoughs had been ironed out, a local and experienced team has been recruited and 'Superstars' are most likely to launch their wrap-around care facility at North Nibley on 1 November. We will advise you of developments.

This has been a journey of learning – disappointments and successes combined – that has seen an expression of need in the Parent Survey 2016 culminate in the provision of a necessary service. We look forward to your support of this venture.

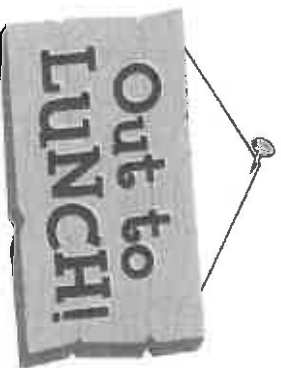

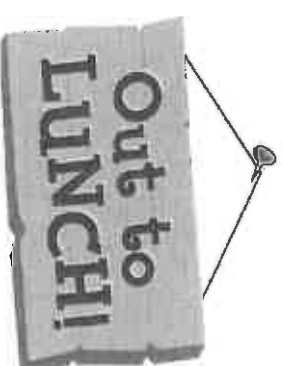

### Important health message from the NHS

We are writing to urge you to check that you have received two doses of Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) vaccine and to be aware of the signs and symptoms of measles, following notification of three confirmed and six probable cases of measles in children and young adults in the Gloucestershire area, with a particular concentration around Stroud.

Measles is a highly infectious viral illness that can be very unpleasant and sometimes lead to serious complications.

Symptoms of measles include the following:

- Cold-like symptoms such as runny nose, red, watery and painful eyes (conjunctivitis)
- High temperature
- Aches and pains
- Dry cough
- Red-brown spotty rash that usually starts behind the ears and spreads to the head and neck or to the rest of the body

If you have any of these symptoms, it is very important to take the following steps to prevent spreading the disease to others:

- Please telephone your GP surgery in the first instance. It is also very important not to go to your GP Practice as you risk passing on the infection to others in the waiting room.
- Please keep away from work or school settings and other people, for five days from when the rash first appeared.
- You should also ensure that you avoid coming into contact with other persons who may be particularly vulnerable. The risk of very serious illness is especially greater in unborn babies of pregnant women, newborn babies, persons with HIV/AIDS, leukaemia and those on cancer drugs.

There is no need to change your school routine unless you suspect you have measles. We would like to remind you to check with your GP that you are up-to-date with immunisations especially the MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) vaccine to ensure that you are protected against those diseases. 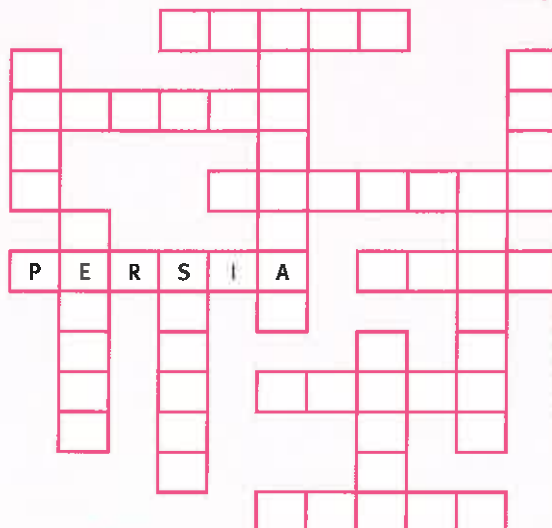
And so it was that Esther's name will be forever be remembered for her willingness to risk everything in the **service** of her people.

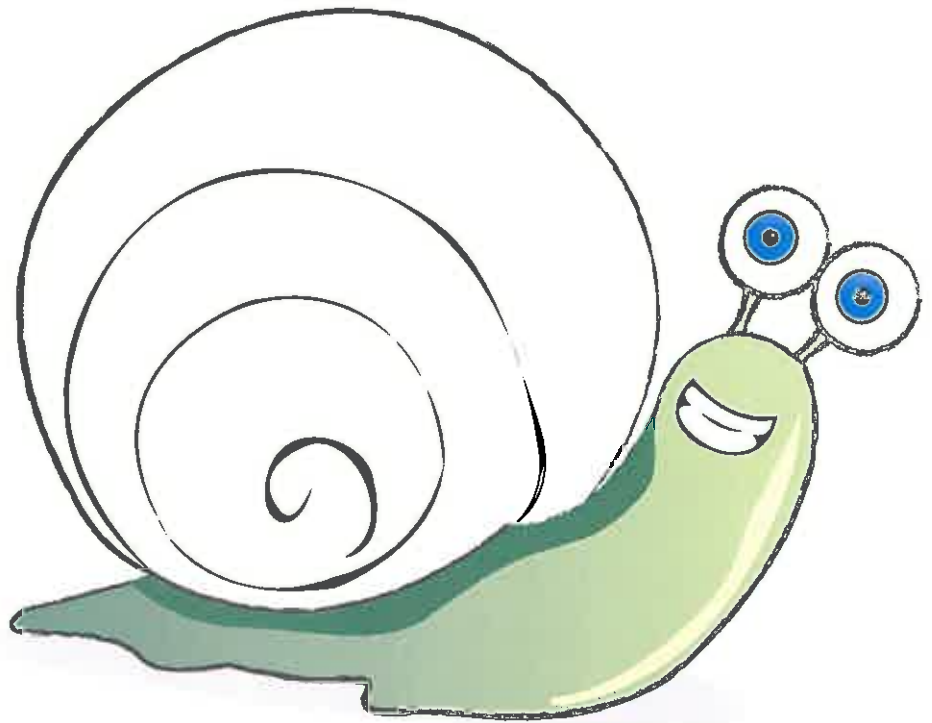
## FAMILY FOCUS

### OBE Award

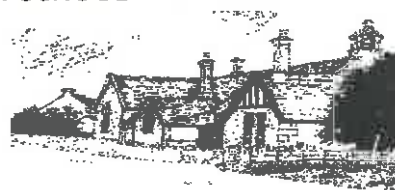
The OBE, Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, is an honour and medal awarded to people who have **served** their country or local community, often as volunteers.

### Parent Governor Election

Dear Parent and carers,

We will have a vacancy for a parent governor from the end of the Autumn Term. Parent governors are elected by and from the parents of children currently attending our school. They serve a four-year term of office and bring a very important and valued perspective to the work of the governing body.

You might like to look at the information for prospective governors on the Gloucestershire County Council website [www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/schoolsnet/governors](http://www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/schoolsnet/governors) Further information on the role can also be obtained through the school office and our Chair of Governors, Sue Bradley-Jones, can be contacted here – [chair@northnibley.gloucs.sch.uk](mailto:chair@northnibley.gloucs.sch.uk) – if you wish to discuss the role before deciding whether to stand.


The governing body has a vital role to play in making sure every child receives the best possible education. This is achieved by ensuring that governors have the necessary skills and commitment to contribute to the effective governance and success of the school. The particular skills that governing bodies need will vary and will include personal qualities and capabilities, such as the ability and willingness to learn and work as part of a team. It is expected that governors will make use of the various training opportunities available to them and play a full part in the work of the governing body.

If you interested in becoming a governor yourself, contact the school office with your nomination (self nomination is acceptable). If you wish to nominate another (current) parent, you can only do so with their permission. Nominations need to be with the school by 3:30 p.m. on Friday 20<sup>th</sup> October.

You must be aware of the Disqualification Regulations printed on the reverse. A ‘Disqualification and Barring Service’ check is required for the role. It is also a requirement to have your details logged within a Department for Education database.

If there are more nominations than vacancies, an election will be held and you will be sent a voting paper.

## **Summary of Disqualification Regulations**

A governor must be aged 18 or over at the time of his or her election or appointment and cannot be a registered pupil at the school. A person cannot hold more than one governorship at the same school.

A person is disqualified from holding or from continuing to hold office as a governor or associate member if he or she:

- fails to attend the governing body meetings - without the consent of the governing body - for a continuous period of six months, beginning with the date of the first meeting missed (not applicable to ex officio governors);
- is the subject of a bankruptcy restrictions order, an interim bankruptcy restrictions order, a debt relief restrictions order, or an interim debt relief restrictions order;
- has had his or her estate sequestrated and the sequestration has not been discharged, annulled or reduced;
- is subject to:
  - i) a disqualification order or disqualification undertaking under the Company Directors Disqualification Act 1986;
  - ii) a disqualification order under the Company Directors Disqualification (Northern Ireland) Order 2002;
  - iii) a disqualification undertaking accepted under the Company Directors Disqualification (Northern Ireland) Order 2002;
  - iv) an order made under Section 429(2)(b) of the Insolvency Act 1986 (failure to pay under a County Court administration order);
- has been removed from the office of trustee for a charity by an order made by the Charity Commission or Commissioners or High Court on the grounds of any misconduct or mismanagement in the administration of the charity, or under Section 34 of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 from being concerned in the management or control of any body;
- is included in the list of people considered by the Secretary of State as unsuitable to work with children or young people;
- is barred from any regulated activity relating to children;
- is subject to a direction of the Secretary of State under section 142 of the Education Act 2002 or section 128 of the Education and Skills Act 2008;
- is disqualified from working with children or from registering for child-minding or providing day-care;
- is disqualified from being an independent school proprietor, teacher or employee by the Secretary of State;
- has been sentenced to three months or more in prison (without the option of a fine) in the five years before becoming a governor or since becoming a governor;
- has received a prison sentence of two and a half years or more in the 20 years before becoming a governor;
- has at any time received a prison sentence of five years or more;
- has been convicted and fined for causing a nuisance or disturbance on school or educational premises during the five years prior to or since appointment or election as a governor;
- refuses a request by the clerk to make an application to the Disclosure and Barring Service for a criminal records certificate.

A person is disqualified from election or appointment as a parent governor if they are an elected member of the LA or if they work at the school for more than 500 hours in any school year.
