Class 3 'step back in time' to the Victorian Era

On Thursday 10th May, Class 3 visited the Black Country Living Museum in order to learn more about their history topic based on the Victorians. 90% of the buildings in the village were real buildings from the Victorian Era that had been taken down brick by brick and rebuilt (like a Lego set) to create this village. We studied the lives of two real Victorian children. Their names were Harry and Lillian. We got to go into their houses and see what they would have looked like. In Lillian's house we even saw her favourite teddy bear.

Miss Parker's group enjoyed visiting the Chemist and they found out about how medicines and tablets were made in the Victorian times and saw the invention that rolled and cut tablets. Mrs Shephard's group enjoyed seeing the steam invention working for real and how it was able to lift a big bucket of coal.

We all participated in a Victorian school lesson taught by a Victorian teacher called Mr Griffiths. He was dressed in smart trousers and a double-breasted waistcoat and jacket. He held a cane in his right hand and never let go of it! He swung it through the air so we could hear the big 'swoosh' it made. He told us how this would be repeatedly done, either to punish children or just for no reason other than to scare them. Caning would only be done on your left hand as the Victorians believed that the devil sat on the left hand side. In the school we had to recite the 2 and 3 times tables as well as the alphabet backwards from memory! The final thing we learnt was that Victorian children wrote letters using 'hooks and hangers'. The only letter that cannot be formed using hooks and hangers is 'O' – well done to Abby who correctly answered this question in the school! Overall, we had a great day and nearly all of us would love to go back again!

It's testing time again at school, and for the Year 6 especially this can feel like a critical moment in time. Parents can help children prepare for next week by revisiting the papers looked at in recent weeks and reminding them of strategies that work in areas where they feel less secure. "Pupils face punishment for using plastic bottles"

In a national first, Brighton College has banned single-use plastics like water bottles, plastic straws or non-biodegradable cups as 'anti-social' and barred them from school premises.
