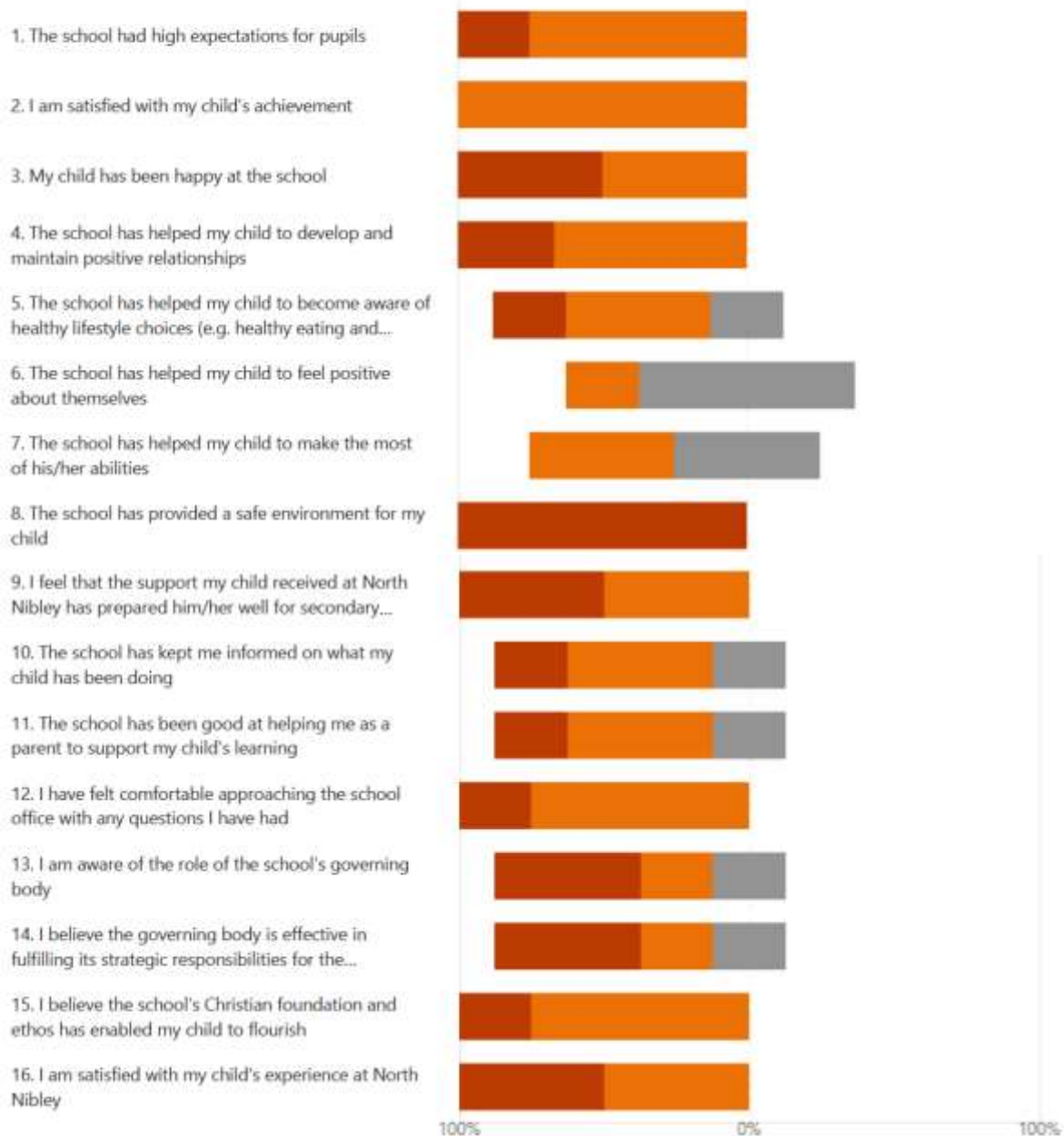

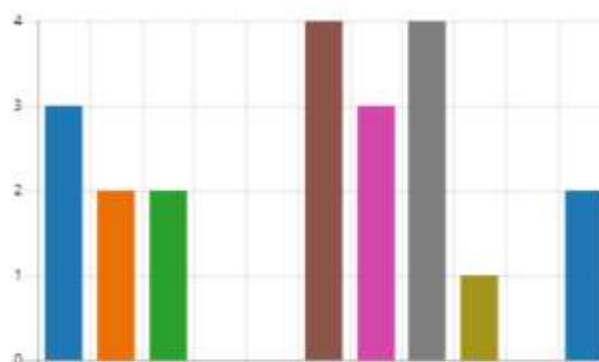

1	anonymous	The virtual learning through teams or zoom was infinitely more effective than worksheets
2	anonymous	Zoom meetings and a timetable work best for home learning in our experience- the interaction with others made a big difference
3	anonymous	The first lockdown saw the school learning with us but were well prepared but more teacher contact would have been preferred. Second lockdown with more on line lessons seemed more effective at engaging the children.
4	anonymous	We felt very supported, particularly from Class 3. The increase in online lessons was a great improvement too and we're grateful to you all for your hard work in such difficult situations. Thank you.

2	anonymous	Help children to understand any special needs any classmates may have, this would encourage empathy and understanding
3	anonymous	Ensure ample notice is given for any parental returns / volunteering requirements
4	anonymous	I wonder if there is a tendency to allow those children in the middle (neither needing extra help or excelling) to disappear a little. The end result can be that those in the middle might not ask as many questions, develop the themselves as much as they could or build their confidence. Communication has also been something we think could improve. We have also found the very few times (just twice in the whole time our eldest has attended Nibley) we've contacted the school to raise a concern or share success that the end result wasn't what we hoped. With a concern we raised it was never acknowledged, actioned or replied too. When we recently shared success we wanted that to be something that our children were recognised for, e.g going up to them and saying well done. We got a reply to us but our hope was that our children were recognised.
